****Sheboyan Case Updates:**

- Sheboyan County currently has 48 confirmed cases of COVID-19. Of those, 41 cases have recovered and are no longer ill. There are no confirmed COVID-19 cases currently hospitalized.
- Active cases** are defined as those individuals who are currently ill and requiring medical care or are in isolation.
- Recovered cases** are defined as confirmed cases where at least 3 days/72 hours have passed since recovery, defined as resolution of fever without the use of fever-reducing medications and improvement in respiratory symptoms, **AND** at least 7 days have passed since symptoms first appeared.
- Negative Tests** are defined as a COVID-19 test with a negative result that was reported to Public Health. For information on testing, see WI testing priorities and procedures section.

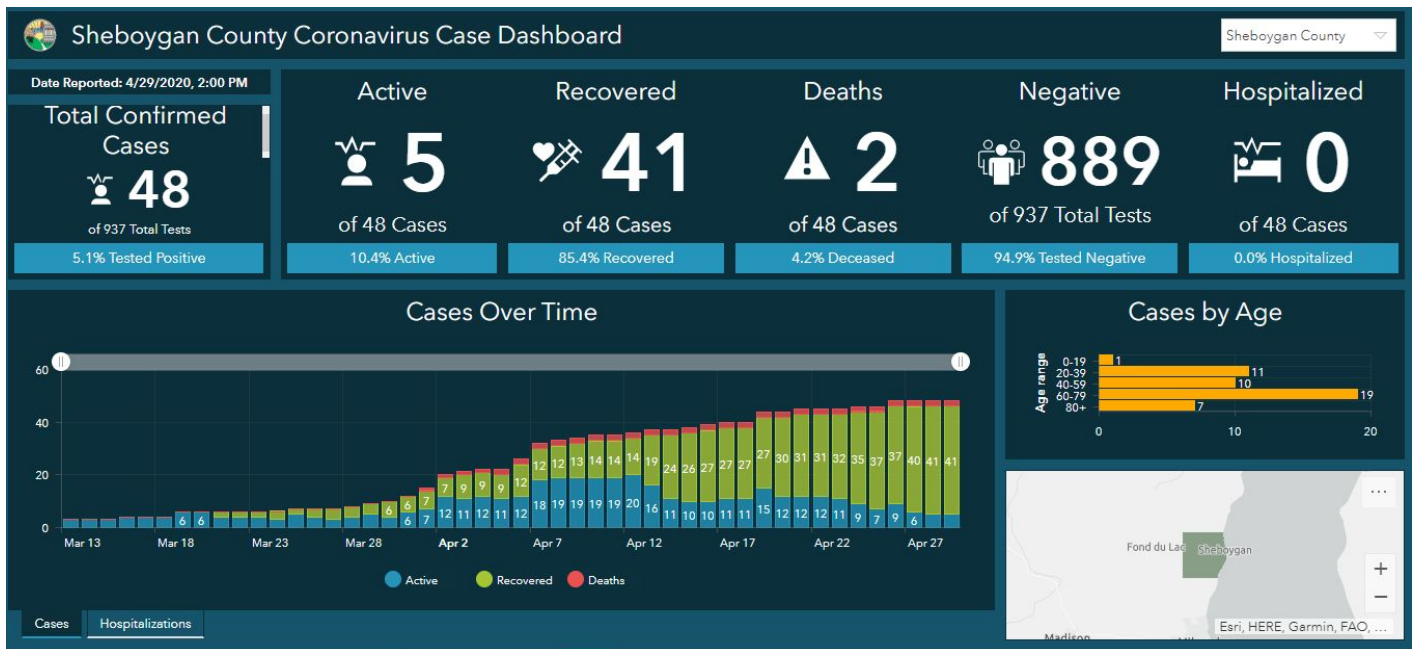

WI State Emergency Operations Center's Response

The [State Emergency Operations Center](#) has brought together government leaders with some of the best and brightest minds in business and technology – all Wisconsinites – to help reduce the spread of COVID-19. Teams at the State Emergency Operations Center are working together to tackle the challenges we face during the COVID-19 pandemic here in Wisconsin. They are creating and implementing plans on important topics like essential supplies, contact tracing, and lab capacity, in an ever-changing situation.

The Badger Bounce Back: Wisconsin's Plan to Get Moving Again

[Badger Bounce Back](#) is Wisconsin's plan to decrease COVID-19 cases and deaths to a low level and increase capacity in our healthcare system so that a phased reopening of businesses is possible. And that means people can get back to work. In order to turn the dial on Safer at Home, we need to increase lab capacity and testing; increase contact tracing and support for isolation and quarantine; track the spread of COVID-19; increase health care capacity; and procure more personal protective equipment. Decisions to move from phase to phase are guided by data, which allows us to re-open while preventing a second wave of COVID-19.

**The Badger Bounce Back plan includes [gating criteria \(metrics and data\)](#) that we will use to determine when we can begin to allow people to interact and, more importantly, get Wisconsinites back to work.

[Safer at Home](#) has saved lives, protected health care workers and critical employees, and prevented hospitals from being overrun, but it is not a workable solution for our economy or our way of life in the long-term. The Badger Bounce Back moves from boxing in Wisconsinites to boxing in COVID-19.
