**Sheboygan Case Updates:

- Sheboygan County currently has 209 confirmed cases of COVID-19. Of those, 178 cases have recovered and are no longer ill. No active cases are currently hospitalized.
- **MONDAY NOTE**-- Today's numbers reflect the incoming cases, recoveries and reported negatives from Saturday and Sunday, as we are only publishing updates Monday-Friday.
- The parentheses after each number reflects the daily change.
- 4 confirmed cases are deceased. Three individuals who passed away are in the 60+ age group and one is in the 40-59 age group.
- Active cases are defined as those individuals who are currently ill and requiring medical care or are in isolation.
- **Recovered cases** are defined as confirmed cases where at least 3 days/72 hours have passed since recovery, defined as resolution of fever without the use of fever-reducing medications





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and improvement in respiratory symptoms, **AND** at least 10 days have passed since symptoms first appeared.

- **Negative Tests** are defined as a COVID-19 test with a negative result that was reported to Public Health. For information on testing, see WI testing priorities and procedures section.
- All Skilled Nursing Facilities are testing staff regularly. If positive cases are identified, Public Health will provide an update.

TODAY'S KEY COMMUNITY MESSAGING:

**Daily Update Notification:

As of the weekend following June 22nd, Sheboygan County Division of Public Health will be publishing our updates Monday-Friday. On Mondays, we will be publishing a summary that will include our weekend numbers. Due to the limited staff capacity on weekends during this continuous response that has spanned over months and is projected to continue for quite some time, we are adopting this new reporting schedule to allow for more efficient ways to analyze the data to publish out to the community.

Prevent the Spread of COVID-19:

COVID-19 continues to be very contagious. We should continue to limit our interactions with others as much as possible to protect ourselves, our communities, and the capacity of our health care system.

- You are safer when you are at home.
- You should continue to limit your trips to the essentials.
- The best way to interact with your friends, family, and neighbors is virtually.
- Practice physical distancing. Standing at least 6 feet apart is a good rule.
- When physical distancing is difficult, we recommend wearing a cloth face covering if you feel safe doing so.
- Wash your hands frequently, and avoid touching your face.

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- If you have symptoms or have been exposed to COVID-19, get tested.
 - Contact your doctor and ask to be tested.
 - Complete an online health <u>screening assessment</u>, and a licensed health practitioner will contact you.
 - See if a community testing site is available near you.

Guidance on Mass Gathering from Sheboygan Division of Public Health:

At this time, WI Department of Health and Human Services and the Sheboygan County Division of Public Health does not advise large gatherings, and there is no projected timeframe available as to when this advisory would change. Public health experts agree that large gatherings of people in sustained, close contact greatly increases the risk for spread of the virus among those who attend the events and to the communities these individuals return to after the event. The communal nature of such events makes it especially challenging to accommodate the physical distancing and sanitation recommendations required to slow the spread of disease. This includes but is not limited to fairs, concerts, festivals, parades, and conferences.

Should you choose to go against this guidance, please follow the recommendations set forth in the Sheboygan County Safe Restart Plan and sector specific guidelines from the Wisconsin Economic Development Corporation.
